


The Area 79 web team carries out routine maintenance of the website and implements the changes and additions requested by the Website Committee or GSC.

APRIL 10 IS A HISTORIC DAY FOR ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS



On April 10, 1939, 4,650 copies of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous,* became available for distribution. Cornwall Press would deliver copies to Works Publishing company, with an office on William Street in Newark, New Jersey. The grand bill for the print run was \$1,783.00!

Copies were also delivered directly to "friends" of the Fellowship, including associates of John D. Rockefeller who aided significantly in the

publishing venture.

Today, over 40 million copies have been sold!

Answered by Drew W., Secretary...The report-backs that are given at the Pre-Conference Assembly are related to the business of A.A. as a whole, as the agenda items each committee is reporting on are related to the General Service Conference (GSC) in New York. All outcomes from the GSC are then published for full disclosure in the Final Conference Report which traditionally is published in October, both in print and as a downloadable PDF. Our committee work that we do at our Pre-Conference Assembly is to help our delegate go to the conference with an informed area conscience on the proposed agenda items and does not act as a deciding body for A.A. as a whole on conference matters...

#3: Suggestions for handling conflicts between members in a committee.

Answered by Pauline D., Archives Chair

Thank you so much for your question. Depending on the level of conflict and disruption to the committee. I have selected 2 quotes from Bill W., who always emphasized the loving, helpful, and tolerant attitude A.A. members should show each other. He wrote in a letter in 1969: "This amount of charity does not mean that we cannot exclude those who disturb meetings or seriously interfere with the functioning of the group. Such people can be asked to quiet down or go elsewhere, or, to come back when they are better able to participate."

Indeed, Bill W. was no stranger to tumult, controversy, or disturbances at A.A. meetings. He also had faith that growth and good could come out of trouble. In *Alcoholics Anonymous Comes of Age*, he writes, "Within A.A., I suppose, we shall always quarrel a good bit. Mostly, I think, about how to do the greatest good for the greatest number of drunks... Surmounting such problems, in A.A.'s rather rugged school of life, is a healthy exercise." (p. 233) I hope these wise words from our co-founder answers your question.

#7: "Is the topic of drugs (i.e. pot, coke, meth etc. considered an outside issue in our meetings?"

#9: Is there a chance that Zoom could be a continuing option at Area quarterlies and assemblies when this pandemic is over?

#11: What does, is there a nonalcoholic Trustee?
