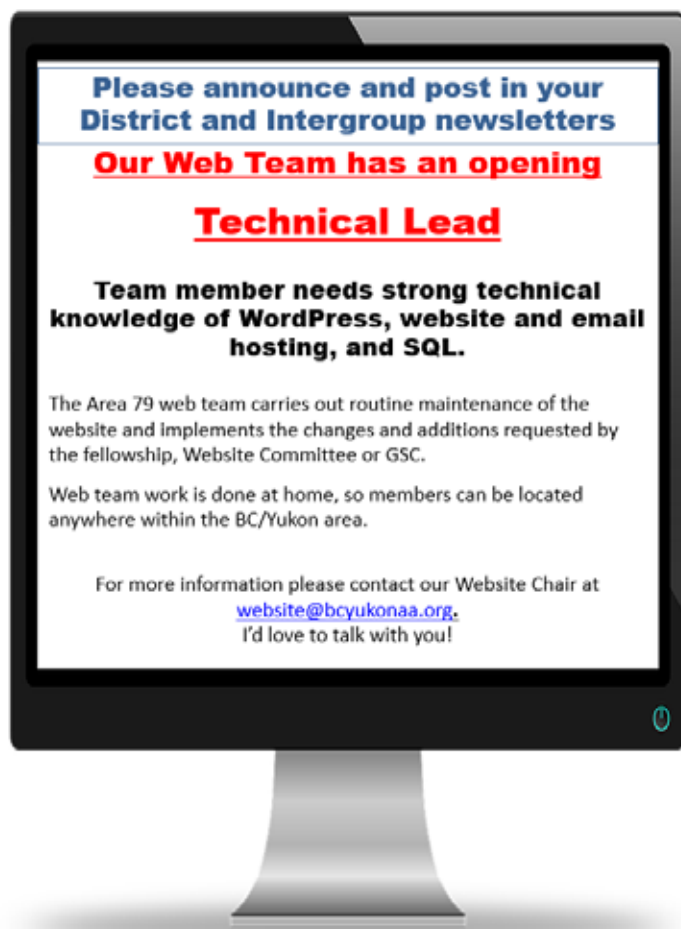

Since we met at the Quarterly in Jan. there has been a steady, though significantly smaller than usual, stream of contributions to the Area from groups and individuals. As you will see when I present the detailed financial report, our expenses too have been far less than usual this year. Overall, our contributions have been \$12,935 more than our expenses.

Given this unprecedented situation of having a significant surplus, I believe it is extremely important that we all think about any area of need, anything we might do to reach alcoholics we are not reaching now.

I would ask all members to forward any ideas to me, as you have them, so we can compile a list of options for the fellowship to consider. We may wish to present some of them as motions by July 31, so time is of the essence. ....

One of my favourite duties as secretary is responding to the messages left on our answering service. These include requests for meeting information and questions about A.A. and Area 79. I respond to general inquiries, ensuring a quick response wherever possible, and pass on any questions to the appropriate General Service Committee member. In the case of people looking for local meetings or contacts, I pass on their information to the DCMs in the appropriate District or to our Website Chair.

I would like to share a little story about how much I love A.A. One evening I was sitting at my computer and received a voicemail. I returned the call immediately and found out that the person I was talking to was quite young and in her first week of not drinking. She seemed frantic about finding an in-person meeting where she lived. She knew of one near her but phoned Area 79 to see if it was in person. I informed her that it was in person and my suggestion was to go to it when it started. In the meantime, I contacted the DCM of that District and the DCM arranged to have five women waiting for her upon her arrival. This all happened in under two hours. I felt so much love and gratitude for A.A. May she find what she needs...
