<u>Cooperation with the Professional</u> <u>Community – Diane O.</u>

The Ad Hoc Committee for creating a learning module for the health authorities is moving along as planned. The committee has submitted a final draft of the Power Point slides to the Content Developer at iLearn, who serves Interior Health. Last week, I had a Zoom meeting with Dr. Luongo who served Alcoholics Anonymous as a Class A Trustee. I recorded Dr Luongo speaking to health care professionals about Alcoholics Anonymous. This recording will also be used in the Power Point Presentation for the BC Health Authorities Learning Hub. The Committee has started with Interior Health and once the presentation is uploaded to their iLearn site, we will approach the other health authorities in BC to have the presentation uploaded to their Learning Hub. The Committee is hoping to give a presentation at an upcoming Area 79 Quarterly or Assembly, once we have a final draft.

I have been busy since the July Quarterly meeting. I received a few packages. I received an old-timer's interview transcript from District 71, group history lists from District 75, and first Grapevine in 1944, the first Pacific North West Region Conference minutes in July 1949 in Seattle, Sapperton Group history, and New Westminster Group history, and membership list in 1946, from Salt Spring.

Meanwhile, I digitized over 100 documents and photos, including the BC/Yukon Convention in 1990 and old-timers' interviews. Especially, I found local iconic members' contents, so I was excited. Those interviews were recorded in 2009, which I have been looking for since I became the Archives Chair.
