## BC/Yukon Area 79 Photocopying/Digitizing Policy

The BC/Yukon Area 79 Archives Committee has been entrusted to safeguard the collection of historical, administrative and organizational records of the Fellowship, as well as other historical material that has been compiled since the early existence of Area 79.

Permission to access our materials and have copies made *does not* signify that a researcher has been given permission to publish, distribute, or further copy the material.

The Archives' photocopying/digitizing policy has been established to protect the physical and the intellectual integrity of the collection. In addition, the policy's purpose is to protect the anonymity and privacy of our members, non-members, and to comply with the Canadian *Copyright Act* as it affects the collection.

Copies of copyright material and certain other materials authorized by the Archives Chairperson will be provided at the discretion of Area 79 within the minimum standards for fair use, for purposes of private study, scholarship or research, and not for further reproduction. Understandably, we would have to decline any request for photocopying that, we believe, would result in a violation of Canadian copyright law. It is the responsibility of the person requesting copies to obtain use rights from the copyright holder. If a person makes a request for, or later uses, a photocopy or reproduction for purposes in excess of "fair use," that person may be liable for copyright infringement. Permission to access our materials and have copies made *does not* signify that a researcher has been given permission to publish, distribute, or further copy the material.

Original correspondence and unpublished manuscripts frequently cannot be reproduced because of:

- 1. Copyright law prohibitions or restrictions;
- 2. The need to preserve the anonymity of persons in accord with A.A.'s Traditions;
- 3. The parties' expectation of privacy; or
- 4. The physical condition.

Copies of early pamphlets and other miscellaneous publications will be made available only when the physical condition of the material allows for copying. The physical condition, the fragility of the item or the brittleness of the original may prevent us from copying some of these items.

BC/Yukon Area 79 in its discretion may refuse to permit photocopying of certain sensitive material.
