Thank you for the question. My first thought would be to definitely get a service sponsor. I have found that my service sponsor has been worth her weight in gold. I am also reminded that we are not alone... All I have to do is reach out for help if I need it. I have also found that joining a Step group, Traditions group, and a Concept group is invaluable. I rely on our literature, *Twelve Steps and* Twelve Traditions pamphlet, our Service Manual and Twelve Concepts for World Service, Twelve Concepts Illustrated pamphlet, our Area 79 Literature Tool, the Area 79 website, www.aa.org, A.A. Comes of Age, The A.A. Group pamphlet, and the Circles of Love and Service pamphlet.

The opportunity to learn and grow never stops.

#21. General Service Conference: 93 areas x\$12K/area = \$1.1 Million. Very expensive! Is there anywhere we can see a breakdown of the costs?Why is it so much? (most expensive parts)

Thank you for the question. The answer is Yes, it is very expensive to facilitate your General Service Conference. Yes, there is a breakdown that will be in the final report of the 73rd General Service Conference but the numbers in the 2023 final report will be the audited financials of the 2022 Conference. The earliest we will see numbers for the 2023 Conference costs will be out after the July Board Weekend. I do have the info of the 2021 Conference which I found in the 2022 final report on page 144 (2021 audited) page 146 (2020 audited). Two years are usually given for comparison. These audited financials on page 144 are for the virtual Conference back in 2021. What I want to do is to direct you to the literature resources where you can look when the next final report comes out. Being mindful that in that report you will have the information from 2022 and 2021, not 2023.
