G.S.O. would take care of the expenses, including booth rental and furniture, which would be paid in advance. Please note that G.S.O. does not cover incidental expenses

for trusted servants, such as parking fees or meals.

We would ask that you and your committee provide A.A. volunteers to staff the booth — to be available to answer questions, provide literature, and serve as a resource for those professionals who stop by. You would be

mailed literature to have at the booth, as well as a banner display."

A bit of nostalgia from **Public Information**, in the legendary "Summer of '69" issue of Box 4-5-9:

A.A. ON TV IN COLOR

The brand new one-minute "public service announcement" about A.A. is now ready for local TV stations, and they are ready for it, if your P.I. Committee, central office or group will furnish it.

All in color, it begins with a foreman, a friend, a wife, and a big boss each saying the kind of thing we all remember hearing about our drinking. Then it points out that A.A. can help. There is space at the finish for you to show your local A.A. telephone number and address.

With the film you also get instructions on how to approach local TV.

One copy costs \$18; two, \$14 each; and three or more, \$10 each.

DID YOU KNOW>>

Public Information is the elder sibling of the **CPC committee.** But did you know...

Until a General Service Board Action of 1970, Cooperation with the Professional Community Committees didn't exist! The functions that we now associate with CPC were part of the Public Information Committees.

From MG-II, AA Guidelines, Cooperation with the Professional Community:

"By action of the General Service Board, January 1970, the trustees' Committee on Cooperation With the Professional Community (C.P.C.) —a spin off from the Public Information Committee—was developed. A similar Conference committee was formed the following year. Since that time, A.A. members in local areas have been responding to local need by establishing C.P.C. committees."

Many Groups and Districts continue to this day to have combined PI/CPC committees, from long standing tradition, for convenience and also the ease of overlap of functions.
