Dear Pam S....., Nursing Educator,




I will also let our Public Information Committee know how much it is appreciated that they have and will continue to stock pamphlets for the staff and clients at the different departments in the hospital.



### Should AA attend?

Our PI/CPC committees we will often be invited to attend and set up tables or otherwise participate in various community events. We do not always have to accept an invitation and it is not always appropriate to do so. Because our attendance at these events means that we are there representing AA as a whole it is suggested that our Committees consider the AA Traditions (T), short and long form, before deciding whether or not to attend. Your Committee may find the following brief suggestions helpful:

- 1) Find out as much as possible about the organization and host of the event through talking with the organizers and doing community and internet research. What is the goal of the organization and their mission?
- 2) Would AA's attendance be in keeping with our primary purpose or affect AA as a whole? (T4)
- 3) Would AA's attendance indicate an affiliation, actual or implied, with an organization which has political or social change goals beyond our primary purpose? (T6)
- 4) Would AA's attendance imply an opinion on an outside controversial issue? (T10)
- 5) Would, or could, the anonymity of the AA members attending be protected? Would AA's attendance be seen as attraction or promotion? (T11)
- 6) What are our member's motivation for attending? Is it purely to carry AA's message? (T12)
- 7) After a discussion with your Committee and /or District and a full consideration of the Traditions, does the vote on a motion to attend pass with substantial unanimity and preserve the Unity (T1) of AA?

While it could be argued that by attending we might have the opportunity to carry the message (T5) at any event, it should be remembered that AA has 12 traditions to live by. The best events for AA to attend will be in keeping with all of our Traditions.

I hope this helps and your Area PI and CPC Chairs will be happy to discuss any invitations that your Committee receives.
